

BUSINESS MEETING – PLEASANT HILL BAPTIST CHURCH – APRIL 5, 2009

The Pleasant Hill Baptist Church met for the monthly business meeting on Sunday, April 5, 2009. We met a week early because of Easter. Bro. Bill called the meeting to order. The clerk did not have the minutes printed for the March meeting.

Treasurer's Report – Brenda Bray said we had received \$350 for the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. Also the insurance had been paid from this month. The motion was made by Chip Lindley to approve the treasurer's report as printed. Motion carried.

Women on Mission – Rose Callahan reported we had delivered 32 Easter baskets to the Samaritan Center and were collecting items for Villa Marie Nursing Home and the Baptist Home in Ozark. A trip to the Baptist Home is being planned.

Deacons' Report – Mike Duncan said the deacons want to meet on a regular basis for outreach and visitation. He talked about a "care program."

Pastor's Report – Bro. Bill said he had been traveling quite a bit. He made two visits and hospital visits as well as several phone calls. He said new jobs are a great challenge and more work. At this time the company is not paying him. He is traveling, has four states, and no staff. He asked for our prayers. The youth lock-in needs volunteers—drivers for Friday night to the bowling alley and cooks for Saturday morning. They like the Wednesday night studies, but the attendance has dwindled.

Old Business – Emily gave a presentation on possibilities for VBS. If we go the Sports route, we can pick 2 or 3 sports for clinics – Volleyball, basketball, and maybe golf. Unity Baptist Church where James Preston was pastor did a sports camp all week in the evenings. They had an adult team captain and a youth assistant. They did a sport, half time, next sport, devotional, etc.

We can also do regular VBS. Most seemed to prefer a weekend instead of week nights. July 17-18 seemed like a good date. We would need 3 volunteers for each of the 3 rotations, plus some for preschool. Possible schedule: Friday 5:15 – 8:30 p.m. Saturday 8:45 a.m. – to 4 p.m. Would have 2 sports for 3 sessions. Preschool would have 4 sports. Ages would be from age 3 to grade 6. Peggy Falk moved we have the VBS Sports Clinic with a tentative date of July 17-18. Motion seconded and carried.

It was announced that Jason Bond's wedding will be on June 26.

David Ford has been in contact with the Missouri Baptist Builders and they are going to build their new house. They will have teams of 10 to 15 people. Sterling Acres Baptist Church will be coming June 7-12. He doesn't know any details yet.

David and Janene just received a phone call from Horseshoe Bend Baptist Church calling him as pastor beginning April 19.
